

Sports Premium Funding 15-16

At Vickerstown, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (P.E) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of P.E and sport provision. Funding will be allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils, including; primary, middle, special and non-maintained special schools, academies and pupil referral units from 1st September 2013. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of P.E and sports provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of. The total amount of funding for 2015/16 is determined by the number of children on role throughout school according to the school census undertaken in January 2015. School's with 17 or more children, as Vickerstown is, receive £8,000 plus a further £5 for every pupil on role.

Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions and training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE sessions.
